RESOLUTION NO. 2009 - 71

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CLAYTON COUNTY TO ADOPT A POLICY TO SOLICIT AND CONSIDER PUBLIC COMMENT PRIOR TO INCREASING TRANSIT FARES OR MAJOR SERVICE REDUCTION; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, Clayton County is a Federal Transit Administration (FTA) grantee by virtue of having received grants from FTA for the operation and maintenance the Clayton County Transit service known as C Tran; and

WHEREAS, as a requirement for receiving these funds FTA requires that the County develop a policy to solicit and consider public comment prior to a fare increase or a major service reduction; and

WHEREAS, Clayton County desires to implement a policy to solicit and consider public comment prior to a fare increase or major service reduction; and

WHEREAS, the County is committed to engaging the public on transit issues related to fare increase or major service reduction; and

WHEREAS, the Clayton County Board of Commissioners deems it in the best interest of the County and the County will be best served by adopting the Clayton County Policy to solicit and consider public comment prior to a fare increase or major service reduction.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS


OF CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED


Section 2. This Resolution shall be effective on the date of its approval by the Board of Commissioners.




