U.S. Army Staff Sergeant Jaime Montalvo

Jaime Montalvo, a native of Newport News, VA, embarked on a remarkable journey of service and achievement from a young age. Enlisting in the U.S. Army immediately after graduating high school at the age of 17 in July 1999, Jaime dedicated 11 years to the nation's defense, attaining the esteemed rank of Staff Sergeant (SSG) before receiving an honorable discharge in September 2010.

Her military journey commenced with rigorous training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO, followed by specialized instruction as an Information Technology Specialist at Fort Gordon, GA. Stationed in Heidelberg, Germany, with the United States Army Medical Command, Europe from 1999 to 2004, Jaime served as a Senior Information Systems Operator/Maintainer, showcasing her technical prowess.

Transitioning to Fort Drum, NY, from 2004 to 2007, Jaime assumed the pivotal role of Automated Data Processor Security Team Chief within the 1st Brigade Combat Team, 10th Mountain Division, including a deployment to Baghdad, Iraq, where she demonstrated exceptional leadership under challenging conditions.

From 2007 to 2010, Jaime served in Holmes, PA, with the U.S. Army Mid-Atlantic Recruiting Battalion as a US Army Recruiter, excelling in recruitment and leadership.

Jaime's commitment to personal development paralleled her military service. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Computer Information Technology from the University of Maryland in 2011, augmenting her academic credentials with a Project Management Undergraduate Certificate in 2018 and a Certified Government Chief Information Officer (CGCIO) designation from the University of Georgia's Carl Vinson Institute of Government in 2021. Furthering her education, Jaime completed an Executive MBA from the Terry College of Business at the University of Georgia in May 2024.

Throughout her distinguished career, Jaime garnered numerous accolades, including the Iraq Campaign Medal for her service during Operation Iraqi Freedom, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal. Her exemplary performance earned her the US Army Gold Recruiter Badge with 2 Sapphire Stars, the Superior Award for MEDCOM Information Management Soldier of the Year in 2003, and recognition as a Commandant's List Graduate of Noncommissioned Officer (NCO) Academy. Jaime's service was further distinguished by 4 Army Commendation Medals, 3 Army Good Conduct Medals, and 2 Army Achievement Medals.

Beyond her professional accomplishments, Jaime finds fulfillment in family life, as a devoted wife and mother to her 10-year-old son. Actively engaged in community service, Jaime serves as the 3rd Vice President for the GA GMIS (Government Management Information Sciences) Georgia Chapter. Since January 2015, she has contributed her expertise to Clayton County's Department of Information Technology. 






History

On September 18, 1979, Resolution 79-36 was signed stating that property owners residing in unincorporated Clayton County desiring street lighting for the area in which they live may petition Clayton County to have such services. The objective of the Clayton County Street Lighting Program is not to illuminate private property but is to illuminate the streets of participating subdivisions in accordance with standards of the American National Standard Practice for Roadway Lighting. Street Lighting is required in all new residential developments. A yearly fee will be added to each property owner's property tax bill.

Procedure

- Step 1: Contact the Clayton County Transportation and Development Street Light Coordinator at
 - 770-477-3674 or street.lights@claytoncountyga.gov
- Step 2: Request a Street Light Petition. The petition must be signed by not less than 50% of the property owners in a defined Street Light District.
- Step 3: Once the petition is complete, mail it to:
 - Clayton County Transportation and Development

Street Light Program

Attn: Street Light Coordinator

7960 N. McDonough Street, Jonesboro, GA 30236

- Step 4: The petition will be checked by the Street Light Coordinator, verifying property owners and to assure that not less than 50% have agreed to street lighting.
- Step 5: A field survey will be performed by the Street Light Coordinator and the utility company representative to determine pole locations and street illumination.
- Step 6: The petition is presented to the Board of Commissioners for approval/disapproval.
- Step 7: Lights will be installed by the Utility Company for all approved petitions. The entire procedure should take 8 to 10 weeks once the signed petitions is received and verified.

Clayton County Residential Street Lighting Program



Street Light Protection Fee

Once the street lights are installed, property owners are billed for a street light assessment on the following tax year's bill.

The rates for street lights are based on frontage as follows, and are subject to change on an annual basis.

For above ground installation the minimum charge is \$35.00 per year up to 125 feet of street frontage. Street frontage over 125 feet is \$35.00 plus \$0.25 per foot, up to a maximum of \$47.00 per year.

For underground installation the minimum charge is \$38.00 per year up to 125 feet of frontage. Frontage over 125 feet is \$38.00 plus \$0.25 per foot, up to a maximum of \$50.00 per year.

Street Lighting

There are currently over 8,000 street lights throughout Clayton County with an annual operating costs of over \$1 million dollars. Street lights are installed and maintained by the local power companies.

It's the law!



KEEP YOUR DOG CONTAINED

If it is outside the house: leash it or fence it.

In Clayton County, Georgia, it is the law that all dogs must be contained and under the control of its owner whenever it is outside its home. That means on a leash or within a fenced yard.

Respect your neighbors and their property.

Dogs picked up wandering loose will be impounded at Clayton County Animal Control. To reclaim your dog, you will need to provide proof of ownership, current rabies vaccination certificate, and proof that the dog is spayed or neutered.

If unable to provide appropriate proof of vaccination or sterilization surgery, then additional fees may be charged.

> Hours of Operation: Monday – Friday 8:00 am – 4:00 pm

Refuse Control is a service provided by Clayton County for residents located in the unincorporated area of Clayton County. This department handles the disposal of certain items that your waste removal company may not pick up.

Refuse Control will pick up yard debris, furniture, appliances, limbs (up to 6" in diameter and no longer than 10 feet), bags of leaves, and miscellaneous items. The following items will <u>not</u> be accepted: tree trunks or stumps, batteries, tires, shingles, sheetrock, bricks, heavy metal, heavy items, mulch, dirt, paint cans, or hazardous items.

Debris Removal:

- Place items to be picked up by the curb on the county's right of way.
- For an inspector to come out to give you an estimate, call Refuse Control at (770) 477-3548.
 (Estimate is at no charge.)
- Debris removal fee is assessed by our inspectors based on the amount and type of debris and the amount of time to load and unload

the debris. However, there is a minimum fee of \$20.00 that will be charged. Payment of fee constitutes acceptance of price. Should you decide to use the County's service, payment can be done in one of four ways:

- Call the office and pay with Visa or MasterCard. (check cards will be accepted if it has a Visa or MasterCard logo)
- 2. Come by the office with cash, check, or money order.
- 3. Mail in check or money order.

Other Services:

Refuse Control also picks up dead animals from the roads. For live wild/stray animals in the road, please call Animal Control (770) 477-3509 and report the location.



CLEAR BOOKBAG MANDATE F.A.Q.

CCPS MANDATES CLEAR BOOKBAGS FOR 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR FOR ALL GRADE LEVELS

Clayton County Public
Schools (CCPS) is excited to
welcome back students for
the first day of school on
Thursday, August 1, 2024. In
preparation for the return to
school, please be reminded
that the district will only allow
students to carry clear
bookbags for the 2024-2025
school year. This decision is
for the safety of all students
and staff and applies to
students in all grade levels.

The district will not provide clear bookbags to all students. Parents/ guardians are required to purchase clear bookbags for their child(ren). For a full list of school supplies and student uniform details, please visit the website of the school your child(ren) is enrolled to attend.

- 1. How does this apply to athletes who carry duffle bags to and from school? Are they not permitted to have duffle bags on campus?
 - Student-athletes with equipment/duffle-type bags are expected to follow a process whereby the bags are turned over to the sport/activity's coach/sponsor upon arrival at school for secured storage until the bags are needed for the activity.

2. What about lunch bags and purses? Do they have to be clear too?

 Lunch bags/boxes or purses do not have to be clear; however, these items will be subject to safety searches at any time. Purse-type backpacks are not allowed.

3. Can bookbags be clear with designs on them?

 Yes. Bookbags can have designs on them. These designs should not completely obscure visibility into the bag.

4. Is this mandate for all grade levels or only grades 3-12?


 All Pre-K through 12th grade students are required to have a clear bookbag.

5. Will students be allowed to use lockers during the upcoming school year?


 Locker usage will be allowed. This will be a localized decision based on school by school leadership and safety measures Clayton County Public Schools is ensuring Clayton READS 30 Minutes Every Day This Summer by partnering with the Clayton County Library System to provide access to books at each library branch and online with eBooks and audiobooks! Please view a video that provides more details at this link. Students can request a digital public library card at https://tinyurl.com/publiclibrarycard or visit any public library branch with a parent or guardian to apply for a library card. Summer reading lists are available from the Clayton County Public Schools website or by visiting https://tinyurl.com/clayton-reads-30. Students are encouraged to complete the Summer Reading Challenges by reading books of interest all summer long. Students who complete the reading challenges can return the page to their Media Specialist in August for a special reward.

Students who read a variety of books each day of the summer are better prepared for the new school year. Ensure your child is reading at least 30 minutes a day all summer long and help us show that Clayton READS!
